CINCOPEX 1992 UPDATE

Our 1992 collaboration with CINCOPEX 1992 is moving right along. One undecided factor is now resolved, the 6-page frames are the official and only size available. It was not possible to borrow or rent 16-page frames at a cost within the CINCOPEX budget. Perhaps, next year?

Those who volunteered to exhibit October 17-18 at Rome but have not yet mailed their entry application and fee should not delay. Again this year space is limited and "first come - first served" will rule. If you intend to enter and exhibit but have not received a prospectus, please write Mr. Franklyn Rudd, 614 N. James St., Rome, N.Y. 13440.

In celebration of our 25th year the awards will be somewhat expanded, as follows:

A major trophy "BEST NEW YORK POSTAL HISTORY" is for competition regardless of club or society membership. The only restriction is that it must be of or principally of NY State postal history material and must, in the opinion of the judges, score the highest against all others in that category.

The next trophy will be for "BEST NY STATE COUNTY EXHIBIT." The entry could include collateral material related to the subject such as post office photos, stage route maps, postmaster photos, etc. The restrictions on this award are twofold - it cannot be awarded to an exhibit which garners the major postal history trophy (above) and the winner must be a member of the ESPHS.

The third trophy will be "BEST FIRST TIME EXHIBIT", open to members of ESPHS only. It is intended to encourage newcomers in the competitive exhibiting to get their feet wet. The exhibit can be of postal history generally, traditional philately or a nice topical theme. The only restriction is that the exhibitor must be a member who has never shown at a national show or a regional show such as CINCOPEX, FOPEX, SYRAPEX, etc.

In addition to the above awards, the ESPHS is pleased to offer a one-year fully paid membership for 1993 to any postal history winner who is not already a member.

These awards are, of course, in addition to any CINCOPEX prize granted by the judges.

Regarding delivery of your exhibits to the show we have observed that the committee is exceptionally strict on handling of entries coming by mail. They are carefully mounted by experienced exhibitors. Nevertheless, it is recommended that all pages be enclosed in an individual protector. Members of the ESPHS will be on hand from Friday afternoon to Sunday evening to offer their assistance to the show committee. Representatives of the 25th Anniversary Committee were there throughout the 1991 show and were quite impressed with the efficiency and care in the mounting and dismounting process.

So, get going on your exhibit, visit the show, take in the ESPHS luncheon and meeting on Saturday.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our 25th Anniversary luncheon will be held on Saturday Oct 17th, at 12:30 PM at the Polish Home in Rome, NY. This meeting will be in conjunction with CINCOPEX. I urge you all to attend.

Ken deLisle is still working on the ESPHS exhibits. There has been some problem with the amount of exhibition space available to the Society. It is in no way Ken's fault, but rather an outgrowth of the limitations and past practices under which the CINCOPEX member clubs operate. If you wish to exhibit you must contact Mr deLisle immediately. It would be a shame if we would not utilize all the frames allotted to us.

David and I have begun working on the 25th Anniversary Journal. We, with the help of my wife, David's mother, put about 25 pages on the computer. We plan to run about 10 pages of John Lange's Waterford, Saratoga County exhibit. I also plan to do an article on the use of Scott 73, the "Black Jack", on NYC local covers. I may also include pages showing postmarks on the 1868 issue. I don't think anyone has done this before, but I could be mistaken. We have excellent articles by Dr. Call and Rodger Curran, as well as a print out of all the articles and books pertaining to NYS (excluding NYC) in the APRL Library. We will also reprint part of Nathan Calkin's book on Buffalo postal history as well as an original article on Orange Lake by Agnes Cavalari.

At the Executive Board meeting held in Albany the second Sunday in September we took up the first substantial changes to the Society's by-laws in over 10 years. I proposed to have a Director who is not up for re-election run the nominations and elections. I would like to do away with the electioneering by giving all candidates for office space for a statement which would accompany the ballots in contested elections. There would be no point to having ballots if there was only one candidate for office. I recommend no voting at annual meetings. I also recommend giving the vote and more power to the President. The Directors would, as now, have to ratify all his/her initiatives before they went into effect. If you want to "get in on the action" attend the meetings.

I hope to meet all our members in Rome. Remember the 50th Anniversary isn't until 2017 and most of us don't have any guarantees.

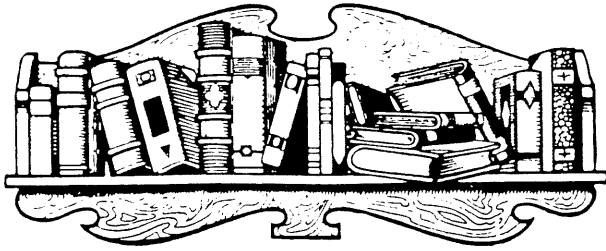

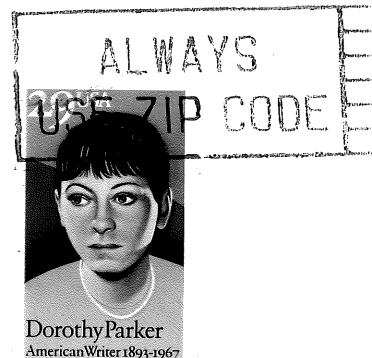
